* Topic 1

* Given Canada's history of diplomacy, as well as its current state of political ambiguity on the international stage, Canada is in an ideal position to take the initiative and foster a new international protocol, which would reflect newer international political realities while working with more feasible action guidelines

* Topic 2

* Mandate a cap and trade policy for all Canadian corporations; tax incentives should be provided for individuals living more sustainable lifestyles; in 4 years CO2 emissions should be stabilized, and then every subsequent 4 years CO2 emissions should decrease exponentially until the 1990 baseline is reached; short term increments should be enforced in order to ensure progress
